

Developmental Language Disorder (DLD): information and resources for families

DLD is a life-long neurodevelopmental condition characterised by differences with understanding and/or using spoken language. DLD has no single known cause and is likely a result of a number of biological, genetic and environmental risk factors. DLD affects social interaction and can significantly impact on emotional and mental wellbeing. DLD is more prevalent than autism affecting approximately 2 pupils in every mainstream class of 30. It is very important to note that DLD affects every individual differently. No two people with DLD are the same and there are a wide variety of ways in which language problems may present and evolve over time. DLD can be difficult to diagnose with some children and young people's good language skills hiding (masking) those that are causing problems.
